Student Responsibilities:

Grading:

Your mid-term grade will be comprised of 70% test and quizzes, 20% labs/projects, and 10% daily assignments. Each marking period is worth 40% of the total semester grade and the final exam is 20% of your semester grade. The grading scale I will be using is below.

If a test is given during the last week of a card marking period a re-take will not be offered.

Homework Policy:

Late work will be accepted for full credit up to the unit test. After the unit test is completed, late work will no longer be accepted for that unit. Homework will be discussed in class and for you to get the most out of the discussion I would suggest doing the homework on time.

Make up or Absent work:

It is your responsibility to make up all work this you missed using the website or the absent bin in the back of the classroom. If you miss a test or quiz day, you will take the test or quiz on the first day back. If you missed the review day you will still take the test on the test day. If you missed a lab it is up to you to talk to me about a time before or after school when you can make up the lab.
